O'SULLIVAN-SCOTT TRIO SYDNEY BOUND



Promising three-year-old filly Force Of Will (number 5) claims a narrow victory at Ellerslie (Trish Dunell)

Matamata trainers Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scott look likely to produce a triple threat at the Sydney autumn carnival after another stellar day for their Wexford Stables at Ellerslie on Saturday.

Fresh off the back of quality three-year-old Rocket Spade (Fastnet Rock) providing the partnership with a gritty victory in the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m), promising three-year old filly **Force Of Will (NZ)** (Power) and hardy stayer **Charles Road** (Myboycharlie) potentially added their names to the travel roster with outstanding performances at Auckland's

premier course.

Force of Will, the Sir Owen Glenn-bred and owned daughter of Power, made it four wins in a row with a narrow but impressive victory against the older horses over 1600m in the last race of the day, just half an hour after Charles Road produced his best run of his current campaign when finishing runner-up to Ocean Billy (NZ) (Ocean Park) in the Gr.1 Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup (3200m).

That has O'Sullivan excited about their respective

prospects with Force Of Will a candidate for the Gr.1 Vinery Stud Stakes (2000m) at Rosehill on March 27, while Charles Road could contest the Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) at Randwick on April 10.

"I thought Force Of Will was very brave as it was her first run for about five weeks," O'Sullivan said.

"We thought she was capable of winning, but we did know whatever she did there would be a heap of improvement in her.

"It got quite tight at the end, so we were pleased to see the line come up with her nose still in front.

"We're looking at the Vinery in Sydney for her next run, which will be a big test against the Aussies as well as going over 2000m for the first time.

"Andrew and I are still trying to work out just how far she wants to go.

"Being by Power you would think there are some distance queries, but her female side has some quality staying blood in it and we think she deserves her chance.

"I know Sir Owen would love to see her get some Australian black type to further enhance her value.

"The track conditions will also dictate a little as she does handle some cut in the track, but we think she is far better suited on top of the ground."

O'Sullivan will also be speaking with owner David Archer as to the plans for Charles Road with the Sydney Cup top of the list of options for him after he ran third in the race back in 2017.

"That was a remarkable run by Charles Road and it was good to see after he didn't have a lot of luck in his lead-up races," he said.

"He stumbled out of the gates at Matamata last time and made up good ground late in the piece, so from a two-mile perspective it was a real pass mark.

"It was a lovely ride by Michael (McNab) as he was three-wide early but got some cover and got a drag into the race when he needed it.

"He finished off strongly and he did have the two-mile

form having done so well over the distance earlier in his career.

"We were certainly cheering him on and the voice is a little hoarse today because of it.

"We'll sit down in the next few days and speak with David about where we go next, but I know he is keen to see him have another go and the horse is definitely going well enough."

O'Sullivan also advised that Rocket Spade had thrived since his New Zealand Derby victory and would make an appearance at the Taupo trials on March 23 before heading to Sydney to tackle the Gr.1 Australian Derby (2400m) at Randwick on April 3.

POMARE THINKING AHEAD WITH OCEAN BILLY

While he is still coming to terms with winning the first Group One of his training career, Rotorua's Bill Pomare knows he could have some big decisions to make with his stable star **Ocean Billy (NZ)** (Ocean Park).

Pomare was enjoying a few quiet moments on Sunday afternoon as he reflected on an amazing journey with the Ocean Park five-year-old that saw him take out the Gr.1 Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup (3200m) at Ellerslie on Saturday.



For Pomare, the victory represents the pinnacle of more than twenty-five years in the thoroughbred training game, but also offers the possibility of an even bigger achievement across the Tasman including a tilt at some of the major staying races on offer.

Typical of his laidback nature, Pomare won't be rushing into any decision, preferring to let some water flow under the bridge as he enjoys the fruits of his latest success.

"It hasn't really sunk in yet," he said.

"I'm actually still expecting to get a call to ask me why I scratched my horse from the Auckland Cup and then I would know what happened really was just a dream.

"Seriously though, it is just an amazing feeling and one which I'm going to enjoy for as long as I can."

Pomare had gone into the race with the belief Ocean Billy could win, especially after the bad luck he had when finishing sixth in the Gr.2 Avondale Cup (2400m) at his previous start.

"We were very confident as I was sure he could win the Avondale Cup the start before," he said.

"His work had been spot on, even though he hadn't raced for nearly two months, but he had a few things go against him and I don't know if it was the best ride that day as well.

"We had a senior rider in Johnathan Parkes aboard on Saturday and that made a big difference, as those senior jockeys know how to position a horse in the big races."

While Pomare was in a bit of a daze after the race, a call from Sydney-based ex-pat Kiwi jockey Jason Collett on Sunday morning soon had his mind focused on the future.

"Jason Collett called me on Sunday morning and told me he thought Billy would be the ideal type for a Sydney Cup," he said.

"He said he watched him on Saturday and thought he was ideally suited and would love to ride him if we did make the trip.

"I was going to think about it for a few days, but late nominations have closed for the race, so it rules it out unfortunately.

"It has however opened me up to the possibility of having a go over there with Brisbane in the winter in the mix.

"There are some snags though, like the COVID-19 isolation requirements when coming home at the moment, along with the fact we still have the stable to run back here."

One of the other considerations for Pomare is the fact that Ocean Billy is used to his own routine and stable environment that may not be able to be replicated in Australia.

"He's not really the type of horse to just pack up and send to someone over there, so realistically my wife Suzie or I would have to go with him," he said.

"I did speak with Murray Baker about it and he said that I should do it myself as I was the one that knew the horse the best.

"He is a lovely horse who just loves people, but he does have his funny little habits. I would hate for someone who didn't know him to get upset if he played up or gave them a little nip as you need to work around that as he will give you everything in return."

Pomare has spent time with co-owner Peter Ludgate who called in to see Pomare and Ocean Billy on Sunday morning and relive the thrill of the victory, while also finding time to chide him for some of his post-race comments.

"Peter came around and we had a look at Billy in his paddock and caught up on what had happened on the day," Pomare said.

"It was very special as Suzie and I got to give him his replica trophy of the Auckland Cup which was quite emotional.

"Mind you he also told me off for saying that I was worried about his heart with all the excitement as it isn't his heart but his lungs that are the problem. His ticker is fine, so we had a good laugh about that as well."

TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS TO DECIDE NEXT TARGET FOR LEVANTE



Excitement machine Levante cruises to victory at Ellerslie (Trish Dunell)

The connections of exciting galloper **Levante (NZ)** (Proisir) will be looking for an indication on any changes to the current trans-Tasman travel restrictions before making a decision on her next raceday assignment.

While one-way travel to Australia is no issue, returning home is a significant headache for New Zealanders, with two weeks quarantine still mandatory and places in managed isolation at a premium.

The four-year-old daughter of Proisir was on her A-game at Ellerslie on Saturday, dominating her rivals in her customary last-to-first style at what was her first try over 1600m.

Most importantly, the high-class mare jumped cleanly from the barriers, having previously bombed the start in the Gr.1 BCD Group Sprint (1400m) at Te Rapa last month.

The Ken and Bev Kelso-trained mare recorded her seventh career victory at just her 10th start and has

quickly become a fan favourite in New Zealand, given her stunning closing speed.

Despite having had the benefit of a barrier trial at Rotorua early in the month to give her some more practice in the starting gates, Ken Kelso admitted he was a little anxious as he watched his charge load away on Saturday.

"It's always in the back of your mind after what she did at Te Rapa," Kelso said.

"She had jumped away well at home when I'd given her some practice with a couple of our older horses.

"She'd also jumped out well at the trials, so I think it was just a one-off sort of thing the other day at Te Rapa where she was in the barriers a long time due to a delay.

"We didn't have to give her the trial, but it was for our own peace of mind and it was a good idea as it helped get her ready for Saturday as it was a month between runs.

"We had been looking forward to getting her up over the mile and she did it pretty easily in the end."

Kelso reported the mare had pulled up in fine fettle after the run and the task now was to decide on whether to press ahead to a start in the A\$1 million Gr.1 Coolmore Legacy Stakes (1600m) at Randwick on April 10 or to tackle the NZ\$200,000 Gr.1 Fiber Fresh New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (1600m) at Te Aroha on the same day.

Both races are restricted to fillies

and mares and run under weight-for-age conditions.

"We have paid a nomination and a first acceptance for the Coolmore Legacy but realistically we are still undecided about making the trip until we can get some more clarity around the current travel restrictions," he said.

"The logistics of it, with quarantine and the like, makes it very hard, so we are looking to see whether there will be a travel bubble or any easing of restrictions before we make a final decision.

"We do have options as there is a Group One mile just half an hour down the road at Te Aroha, so it is not like we don't have anything else to look at.

"That Australian race will attract the cream of the crop with horses like Arcadia Queen and Probabeel possibly joining a number of the ones that ran in the Coolmore Classic (Gr.1, 1500m) at Rosehill yesterday, so it will be no easy task.

"We would like to take her over there and if we don't go this time there is still Melbourne in the spring as another option."

Kelso also advised that Levante's promising stablemate Les Crayeres (NZ) (Redoute's Choice) had enjoyed a week in the paddock after finishing third at Ellerslie on New Zealand Derby day and would most likely be back in action within the next two weeks.

Masterful ride from Harry gets Meryl home

A'Isisuhairi Kasim looked in a precarious spot when his saddle slipped back badly over **Meryl's (NZ)** (Rock 'N' Pop) rump at a crucial stage of the \$50,000 Class 4 race over 1600m at Kranji on Sunday, but the raw riding instincts picked up from a young age helped him stay on – and win!

Just when Meryl was peeled out for her run at the top of the straight, A'Isisuhairi suddenly found himself in trouble, unable to assist his ride to the fullest, and leaving spectators wondering how he would avoid getting unseated.

But "Harry", as he is popularly known, didn't let that untimely setback break his confidence or momentum for too long. Somehow, he rebalanced his body and riding rhythm, which enabled him to still extract the best out of James Peters' bonny mare.

"At the 400m, I could already feel unbalanced, but she was responding so well I had to keep riding her out," said A'Isisuhairi.

"The saddle then went right back, but I was able to stay on, and she was very brave to the line. She really deserved that win as she had to be used up from the wide draw at her last start."

A four-year-old mare by Rock 'N' Pop, Meryl has amassed more than \$120,000 in prizemoney from her three wins and four thirds for the Oscar Racing Stable.





HAPPY DAYS FOR **HAPPY FRIDAY**

After knocking on the door a couple of times, **Happy Friday (NZ)** (Shooting To Win) finally gave connections reasons to enjoy a first celebratory drink on Sunday.

Second at his last start and third a few runs back, the Shooting To Win four-year-old put it all together in the \$20,000 Open Maiden race over 1200m on the Polytrack to secure the supreme podium spot that had proven elusive thus far.

Stalking up the speed in a smothered spot behind the leaders, Happy Friday was produced at the right time inside the last 300m, tackling the fighting pair of Ima (Helmet) and Wawasan (NZ) (Jakkaalberry) before gaining the upperhand on Ima by half-a-length.

Wawasan looked a winning proposition when he drew on level terms with Ima halfway up the straight but the Desmond Koh-trained galloper peaked on his run to settle for third place another three-quarter length away.

Happy Friday clocked the time of 1min 12.66secs for the 1200m on the Polytrack, and has now collected in excess of \$30,000 of prizemoney from his one win, two seconds and four thirds for his owner Mr Sia Wei Kiang.

John, who prior to that breakthrough, rode Happy Friday to one third and two seconds, including the time the gelding was trained by Mark Walker, said the key to the win boiled down to leaving that run as late as possible.

"It's all about the timing. Last time, he kicked to the front too early and he stopped," said the local hoop.

"Today, the pace suited him and I waited longer for that last kick in the straight. It's just nice that the two horses in front kicked at the same time and were going at the same speed.

"That allowed us to chase them for a longer time. Everything went good for him today."

Ky Young, who was saddling Happy Friday only for the second time, was hoping the winning flair had been unlocked after that confidence-building maiden victory.

"I left it to John to ride the horse the way he saw fit as he knows the horse well," said the Singaporean handler.

"He summed up the race very well and let's hope that first win will now boost the horse's confidence."
