GLORY DAYS PLEASES IN MELBOURNE DEBUT



Glory Days wins the 2019 Gr.1 Auckland Cup at Ellerslie (Trish Dunell)

It's not often that a trainer leaves a racecourse with a smile on their face after finishing out of the money but that was the case for Waverley's Bill Thurlow at Flemington on Saturday.

Thurlow was reflecting on the performance of his Gr.1 Auckland Cup (3200m) winner **Glory Days (NZ)** (Red Giant), who demonstrated a good turn of foot under the steadier of 60.5kgs as she stormed into fifth over 1700m to close out the programme at Melbourne's racing headquarters.

While expecting Glory Days to improve on her first-up

performance in New Zealand, where she struggled when finishing at the rear over 1400m on a waterlogged surface at Otaki, Thurlow admitted he was looking for a confidence booster as he plots a course to the Gr.1 Lexus Melbourne Cup (3200m) for the bonny seven-year-old mare.

"She went super and we are very pleased with that performance," he said.

"It was quite a strong field and she was giving up to 6kgs to the ones who finished in front of her, so you have to be thrilled with a run like that."

"We were realistic about our winning chances before the race and I just wanted to see her get home well, so she really did live right up to expectations with the run."

Thurlow was also buoyed by the post-race comments of jockey Craig Williams who was suitably impressed by the mare.

"Craig was very taken by the finishing burst she put up as he had thought she might have struggled after going a little keenly early on," Thurlow said.

"She probably just battled that last 50m but he said the move she made to get into the finish from the 300m was very impressive."

"Hopefully he will want to stick with her for her next start as he did ask to be kept in the loop but he is in hot demand so you just never know."

Thurlow will assess how his charge comes through Saturday's run before making any firm plans for her, although he is weighing up two potential options.

"It will all depend on her recovery rate but our first option is the Benalla Cup (2046m) in two weeks," he said.

"If she takes a little longer then we will most likely go to the Bart Cummings (Gr.3, 2500m) at Flemington a week later."

"She would carry a bit of weight in the Benalla Cup but it might be away from the top ones and is getting up to a more suitable distance."

Thurlow was also buoyed by comments from Racing Victoria's chief handicapper, Greg Carpenter, when discussing the prospects of Glory Days making the final field for the Melbourne Cup from her current position of 39th on the order of entry.

"Greg introduced himself to me on Saturday and we had a really good chat about the Cup," Thurlow said.

"He did mention that in a normal year she would be well placed to make the final field after defections but you just never know."

"We chatted after the race as well and he thought the mare had gone really well and would be keeping an eye on her over the next few starts."

Thurlow will head back to his Waverley base on Sunday where he will put the finishing touches on last season's Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks (2400m) runner-up, Beyond The Fort (NZ) (Niagara), as she prepares to make her four-year-old debut.

"Beyond The Fort is heading to the trials at Foxton on Tuesday and is pretty close to her first start for the season," he said.

"She trialled up nicely at the start of the month and has come on well."

"Tuesday will bring her on again for her first run which is likely to be at Hawera in early October."

"We will take it quietly with her but a race like the Waverley Cup in November could be a nice target and a great race to win on our home patch."

GEORGE MAIN TO DECIDE VERRY ELLEEGANT PATH

The Gr.1 George Main Stakes (1600m) looms as a campaign-defining race for **Verry Elleegant (NZ)** (Zed) with trainer Chris Waller to weigh up the mare's options after the Group One event.

Waller admits Verry Elleegant's first run as a four-year-old when she beat just one runner home in the Gr.1 Winx Stakes (1400m) was a head-scratcher.

She ended her Classic year as the winner of the Gr.1 Vinery Stud Stakes (2000m) and Gr.1 Australian Oaks (2400m) and had two trials before the Winx on August 24.

The trainer changed her work around on Saturday morning.

"I just wasn't sure where she was at after her first-up run so we gave her a gallop with a couple of other horses," Waller said.

"She's always been working on her own so we made her do

a bit and I was very happy with what she did and I think she took a bit of confidence from the work as well.

"I was scratching my head after her first-up run. I think if she goes well in the George Main she'll go down the Cox Plate path.

"If she's a bit plain there, I would consider a mares' path. Obviously the Caulfield Cup is high on the priority list.

"So we've got three options, the Cox Plate, the Caulfield Cup, and the mares' path."

Waller said the transition for three-year-olds to their four-year-old season could take time.

"I call them four-year-old fillies because they're still not quite there," he said.

"I think next Saturday will tell me if she's there or not." AAP

THE BOSTONIAN ON TARGET FOR AUSTRALIAN GROUP ONE

Class sprinter **The Bostonian** (NZ) (Jimmy Choux) will head to Melbourne on Wednesday as he gets ready to tackle the Gr.1 Moir Stakes (1000m) at Moonee Valley on September 27.

Trainer Tony Pike is pleased with how the Jimmy Choux five-year-old has come through his winter break after a successful Queensland

campaign that saw him strike twice at Group One level in the Doomben 10,000 (1200m) and Kingsford-Smith Cup (1300m).

"He is looking a picture and has really wintered well," Pike said.

"Last season he didn't come out of his winter break nearly as well and I think that was pretty clear in the performances he put up.

"We brought him back straight after his last run at Brisbane in the Stradbroke (Gr.1, 1400m) this time and he has thrived."

Pike is realistic about the task ahead of his charge.

"There aren't too many kiwi horses who take on the best sprinters in Australia but that's the position we

find ourselves in after his Queensland performances," he said.

"I guess with the battle between Victoria and New South Wales racing it might see some of the better ones in Sydney rather than Melbourne but in saying that the competition will still be white hot wherever we go.

"He's fully mature now and we think on what he did in Queensland he is up to the task, so we are about to find out."

Pike will use a jump-out at Flemington on Friday to put the finishing touches on The Bostonian's preparation for the Moir Stakes, a race that was won by Viddora (I Am Invincible) last year before she went

on to compete against the world's best sprinters in the Gr.1 Al Quoz Sprint (1200m) later in her campaign.

"He flies over Wednesday then will have a half mile jump-out at Flemington on the Friday," Pike said.

"He goes well fresh and that jump-out should top him off nicely.

"It will be his first attempt at Moonee Valley but I think the track will suit him as he is pretty nippy and the surface doesn't get rock hard which will be in his favour.

"As with most of those races the barrier draw will be crucial so we will be keen to draw well to give him his best chance."

The Bostonian will be accompanied

across the Tasman by last-start Hastings winner Spring Bouquet (NZ) (Darci Brahma), with The Oaks Stud bred and owned mare kicking off her campaign in a Benchmark78 1600m contest at Flemington on September 25.

"The Oaks Stud were keen to test her (Spring Bouquet) in Melbourne so she will head over with The Bostonian," Pike said.

"She will kick off over 1600m at Flemington and then we will place her from there.

"She is a mare with a very good turn of foot so I expect her to be very competitive in the right grade over there."

SATURDAY DOUBLE CAPS OFF STUNNING WEEK FOR SHOCKING

Rich Hill Stud principal John Thompson was a happy man as he reflected on a wonderful week for his resident stallion **Shocking** (Street Cry) while sipping on his Sunday morning coffee.

A brace of Australian victories on Saturday capped off a seven-day stretch that saw the dual Group One winning son of Street Cry produce eight individual winners throughout Australia, New Zealand and Macau.

Amongst those successes was impressive Rosehill winner Shock Alert (NZ) for former kiwi trainer Bjorn Baker while promising three-year-old Zelenski (NZ) added a black-type placing to his record at just his fourth start when finishing third behind Catalyst, (NZ) (Darci Brahma) in the Gr.3 Cambridge Stud Northland Breeders' Stakes (1200m) at Ruakaka.

Thompson is delighted with the success for Shocking who he believes has become one of the forgotten sires in the local market despite fashioning an impressive record since he commenced duties at Rich Hill eight years ago.

"It is great to see him (Shocking) doing the business as he has always been a consistent producer of horses that win races," Thompson said.

"In his first crop there were four individual stakes winners including Fanatic (NZ) who won the New Zealand Oaks (Gr.1, 2400m), Chocante (NZ) who won the Brisbane Cup (Gr.2, 2400m) and The Hessler (NZ) who won the Championship Stakes (Gr.2, 2200m) at Ellerslie.

"He has had a steady stream of black-type winners since then along with a number of horses who have gone on to win multiple races across a variety of distances.

"The number of mares he has been getting has dropped away as it tends to do with a number of stallions but with the backing of a good syndicate of owners behind him, he has still managed to maintain a steady stream of winners.

"At a fee of \$8,500 this season I think his record shows he is tremendous value as a proven producer that the market may have forgotten a little."

As the spring racing scene in Melbourne hots up Thompson is also excited about the feature race prospects for Gr.2 Adelaide Cup (3200m) winner Surprise Baby (NZ) who is on track for a tilt at the big one, the Gr.1 Lexus Melbourne Cup (3200m).

"His (Surprise Baby) win in the Adelaide Cup was a hell of a thrill and he looks to have come back even better for this campaign," Thompson said.

"He put in an enormous run for fourth first up at Moonee Valley, where he came from near last to finish just in behind them.

"I understand he is heading to the Bart Cummings (Gr.3, 2500m) where a win would qualify him for the Melbourne Cup.

"If he could perform well in the race that his sire won then that would be a pretty memorable day for everyone."

Thompson is also paying particular attention to Shocking's other weekend winner in Vegas Jewel (NZ) who was successful on debut at Echuca after being sold through the Stud draft for \$130,000 at the 2018 National Yearling Sale.

"I've kept an eye on the filly after we sold her at Karaka last year," he said.

"She is trained by Mark Kavanagh and is out of Vegas Magic who is a half-sister to Vegas Showgirl, the dam of Winx.

"She was a cracking foal and from all reports did it pretty easily on Saturday.

"You never know how they will go on but the Street Cry connection through Shocking and Winx is very interesting for us."

With Shocking still having spaces available in his bookings for the current breeding season Thompson is hopeful that the latest run of success will translate to greater interest from local breeders who haven't yet settled on their 2019 matings.

"We would like to see more mares being sent to him and there is space available," he said.

"He is getting the results to back up our confidence in him so hopefully that can boost his numbers further this season."

MARSH GOES OUT WITH A SUPERNOVA BIG BANG

Outgoing trainer Bruce Marsh could not have scripted his farewell meeting any better when he led in his favourite horse, old marvel **Supernova (NZ)** (Elusive City), as his last Singapore winner on Sunday.

The 69-year-old New Zealander has called a day on his 14-year-old stint at Kranji with the stable being handed over to his assistant-trainer Jason Ong from Monday.

Already a successful trainer at his Woodville stables in New Zealand before he made the big move in 2005, Marsh carried on as the quiet achiever he has always been to go and reach the same lofty heights at Kranji, notably with two Emirates Singapore Derby wins - the first one, Hello And Goodbye, remarkably his very first winner at Kranji – and a Singapore Three-Year-Old Challenge clean sweep with Gingerbread Man among others.

But that heart-stopping win by 11-year-old Supernova in a modest \$50,000 Class 4 race over the Polytrack mile will undoubtedly rank highly among his long list of achievements at Kranji.

Just to see a host of his peers like Lee Freedman, Donna Logan, John O'Hara, Tan Kah Soon, Cliff Brown and even ex-trainer Brian Dean as well as owners like Mr Cheah Kim Teck,

jockeys, syces, officials come down to celebrate with him and wish him well at the winner's circle was a measure of how popular Marsh was among the close-knit Kranji racing fraternity.

"I'm so pleased Supernova won my last race here. Zy (Nor Azman, his apprentice jockey) gave him a perfect 10-out-of-10 ride," said Marsh who had wife Kay by his side.

"I've never seen Zy so strong to the line. I'm over the moon.

"This horse is my favourite at the stable. He's got good clean legs, he's a real 'class' horse. To do this when is such an old horse is just amazing.

"I'd like to thank all the owners who have supported me from Day 1 and my marvellous staff, too."

While it was written in the skies Supernova would be the 417th and last bright shining star among Marsh's constellation of winners at Kranji, it was also fitting it was supplied by his long-serving protégé Zy.

"That's the least I could do for my boss. He has always been supportive and also sent me to New Zealand (for further training)," said the Singaporean rider.

"To do it for him, have his favourite horse win on the line, I'm just so


honoured to be the jockey to do that for him, for the horse.

"I gave it my all inside the last 200m. Even Supernova was giving his best.

"In the last 50m, I was like 'come on, boy, get there, get there' and he got there. I'm very happy."

Supernova might have been at an age when many of his peers would be put to pasture, but here he was at that epic defining moment, digging deep into his entrails and reserve tank like a three-year-old, pumping every blood from his arteries through that big heart of his for only one man.

Kranji held its breath - and to the explosion of joy felt across the grandstand and beyond (definitely in New Zealand where our races are watched 'live' every week), the racing Gods have smiled on Supernova - and for one last time on his trainer, Bruce Rangi Marsh.

CHER FINALLY BURSTS INTO SONG

The Donna Logan-trained **Cher (NZ)** (Showcasing) opened her account with a hard-fought win in the \$20,000 Maiden race over 1600m on Sunday.

The Oscar Racing Stable-owned mare by Showcasing had never earned a place cheque at her previous five starts but did give obvious signs she had made headway at her last start when a closing fourth in an Open Maiden race over 1400m.

The step-up to the mile next time out was seen as a logical progression but to see the four-year-old take the lead under apprentice Simon Kok Wei Hoong did take a few by surprise.

Running in the second Oscar colours but trained by Lee Freedman, Mr Rockwell (Fastnet Rock) came ranging alongside Cher into the backstretch, with Glamorous (NZ) (Guillotine) soon joining in to make a line of three.

While Cher did not have to dig down too deep to shake off her travelling companions upon straightening, Majestic (Mizzen Mast), the fresh legs on the scene, was sneaking up along the rails as the only real threat, but Cher also repelled

that rather easily to go and score by 1 1/4 lengths.

"She didn't acclimatise very well, she was off her feed, but we've turned her around," said Logan.

"Her fifth start was encouraging. We put a claimer on her today and she was well in it.

"I didn't expect her to lead, but she did it easily. I did panic when the other horse came up, but she held on very well."

Logan had Ravi Rawa, an assistant-trainer from Mauritius, among her guests at the lead-in. Rawa is looking to join the Kiwi handler as her assistant-trainer.

"Looks like I brought Donna luck," said the former jockey who gained experience in other aspects of horse training in Perth after he hung up his boots.

"It's a nice set-up here, different from what I'm used to back home. It would be nice to get some work experience here."
