DECEMBER BOUND GOLDEN SIXTY TAKES THE CELEBRATION CUP



Golden Sixty dashes clear to win the Gr.3 Celebration Cup (1400m) at Sha Tin (HKJC)

New Zealand Bloodstock Ready To Run Sale graduate **Golden Sixty** (Medaglia D'Oro) kicked off his five-year-old campaign where he left off last season with an effortless victory in the Gr.3 Celebration Cup (1400m) at Sha Tin.

Golden Sixty took the first step on his path toward the 2020 LONGINES Hong Kong International Races at the same time thwarting Beauty Generation's(NZ) (Road To Rock) tilt at a fourth straight triumph in the race.

With his devastating turn-of-foot on display once again,

the newly turned five-year-old made it eight wins in a row, following on from his Four-Year-Old Classic Series clean sweep which culminated with Derby glory.

Hong Kong's first Pattern race this season was billed as the clash between Beauty Generation and Golden Sixty and it did not disappoint, with the latter reigning supreme for trainer Francis Lui and jockey Vincent Ho.

"I think at the moment he is the best horse that I have trained - he'll step up in distance to 1600m now and then of

course the target is the Hong Kong International Races," Lui said.

Lui purchased Golden Sixty out of Riversley Park's 2017 New Zealand Bloodstock Ready To Run Sale draft for \$300,000 after Riversley Park principal Sam Beatson and friend Ben Foote had pinhooked the son of Medaglia d'Oro as a yearling for A\$120,000.

The Medaglia d'Oro gelding made the most of the 17 pounds he received off the two-time Horse of the Year, Beauty Generation (133lb), who finished a dead-heat second alongside Champion's Way (Hinchinbrook) by one and three quarter lengths.

"It's very exciting to be back on him (Golden Sixty), he felt great and fresh today - once I got a clear run I knew he'd run them down," Ho said.

"I think he is one of the best horses in Hong Kong at the moment."

After breaking cleanly Golden Sixty was snagged back to settle worse than midfield while Beauty Generation, under the guidance of Zac Purton, would stalk the leading duo on the rail.

As the field turned for home; Golden Sixty quickened when asked, while Beauty Generation hit traffic and had to bullock his way clear to share second prize.

"He pulled up well, it was a good blow for him - he needed that, I think he was around 70 to 75 percent fit before this run and after this he should go up even more, of course with the aim of December," Ho said.

But it wasn't altogether smooth sailing for the winning camp, as Lui spoke of his concerns pre-race as his stable star danced and buzzed around the parade ring before the race.

"I was worried about him before the race in the parade ring because he was so excited but in the race he was under control," Lui said.

The December riches on offer for Golden Sixty are the \$25 million Hong Kong Mile or the HK\$28 million Hong Kong Cup, should Lui opt to step up to the Derby distance of 2000m again.

EMOCEAN RISES TO THE TASK IN CLASSIC

Four-year-old mare **High Emocean (NZ)** (Ocean Park) has added black-type to her already impressive resume with a dominant victory in the Listed R.M. Ansett Classic (2415m) at Mornington on Sunday.

By Ocean Park, the mare has now won five from 11 races with another five placings and continues to impress the stable with her toughness.

"That was fantastic, she's an amazing little filly, she's very brave," co-trainer David Eustace said.

"It was the plan to come here and win a stakes races with her being a mare."

With her flourishing in the teams set up and able to stay in work for an extended time, Eustace said they're not afraid to look forward to the Flemington carnival with her.

"She's a genuine stayer, so a Sandown Cup would have to be a consideration for her, or a staying race over the carnival at Flemington," he said.

"We know she stays, we know she's fit, so we'll keep spacing her runs."

High Emocean sat back off a muddling pace set up by Kiwi raider Our Big Mike (NZ) (Don Eduardo) before unleashing a sustained run around the field to take control of the race on the point of the home bend.

Rider Jye McNeil kept her up to the mark as she surged clear to defeat race favourite Tavirun (NZ) (Tavistock) by a widening four and half lengths at the winning post.

Bred by Llanhennock Trust, High Emocean is the third foal out of High Chaparral mare High Joy and was purchased by John Foote Bloodstock and Darren Weir Racing for \$80,000 from the Wentwood Grange draft during the 2018 Book 1 Sale at Karaka.

JAMES PAIR READY FOR SUMMER STAYING ASSIGNMENTS

Cambridge conditioner Roger James got what he was looking for at Ellerslie on Saturday when progressive stayers **Concert Hall (NZ)** (Savabeel) and **London Banker (NZ)** (Tavistock) performed with distinction in their first-up assignments.

Gr.3 Manawatu Cup (2300m) winner Concert Hall stormed home late to push eventual winner Dawn Patrol (NZ) (Dawn Approach) close in an open 1400m event while lightly raced five-year-old London Banker finished close up in third behind longshot winner Lord Sibford (NZ) (Darci Brahma) over 1600m.

James, who prepares the pair with training partner Robert Wellwood, was keen to see how both runners would measure up as he looks toward the staying features later this year.

London Banker burst on the scene last summer with three

consecutive victories to close out his first full campaign and had looked ready to return off the back of a runner-up finish over 1200m at the Te Teko trials in August.

"It was no real surprise that he ran a good race as he is very capable at a mile," James said.

"It was very pleasing as he has a big preparation ahead of him.

"I've always thought he would make into this sort of horse as I've felt he is typical of the classic, old fashioned kiwi-bred stayer that takes a bit of time.

"He reminds me so much of the type of horse that trainers like Jim Gibbs and Dave O'Sullivan did so well with, those types that had very light campaigns early on and were starting to be seen at their best in the big staying races once they had turned five and older.

"He has been a bit weak but has plenty of ability and his form at the end of his last campaign was enormous.

"We will look at the Cup races over the summer for him and if he can keep progressing, then there could well be something for him in Australia in the autumn."

James has a similar path planned for Concert Hall who he felt could have won on Saturday with a little more luck in the run home.

"She is a mare that has always had ability but it was great to see the turn of foot she had over 1400m which is well short of her best," he said.

"She's had a long slow build up and has a good base of fitness.

"I watched the race replay on Sunday morning and thought that if she had got a clearer run then the race might almost have been hers.

"It was still very pleasing and indicated she has a lot ahead of her.

"I'm going to see how they both come through their runs but after performances like that, I wouldn't expect them to have their next starts for three to four weeks."

James will now focus his attention on the second day of

the Hastings carnival this coming Saturday where Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m) runner up Two Illicit (NZ) (Jimmy Choux) will line up in the feature event, the Gr.1 Windsor Park Plate (1600m).

"I'm not sure if they are getting the rain that Cambridge is at the moment but I'm not too concerned about the track as she can handle some cut in it," he said.

"It's still a week out so there is plenty of time to go so it is a little bit early to worry about something like that.

"She is right on tune and has come through her first up win really well so we're looking forward to the day."

The long-range forecast for the Hawke's Bay region shows fine weather in the lead up to Saturday's meeting with the Hastings track expected to present in perfect order.

COLLETT HAS HIGH HOPES FOR IMPRESSIVE ELLERSLIE WINNER



Super Strike storms to victory at Ellerslie (Trish Dunell)

Progressive galloper **Super Strike (NZ)** (Super Easy) reminded racing pundits of his undoubted ability when he produced a powerful finish to score first up over 1200m at Ellerslie on Saturday.

The Super Easy gelding had been off the scene since sustaining a muscle injury when running second at the venue back in December last year.

Trainer Richard Collett took a patient approach with the Janet Hepi bred and owned four-year-old who has taken time to grow into his imposing frame. Two handy trial outings at Ruakaka sharpened him up for his raceday reappearance and he looked

every inch a galloper going places as he easily lumped topweight of 59.5kgs to victory in the hands of Collett's son-in-law Andrew Calder.

Collett wasn't on hand to witness the triumph as he was in New Plymouth with stablemate Sweet Clementine (NZ) (Sweet Orange), who went a bottler to finish fourth in their Group Three feature but was pleased with the race report from Calder.

"Andrew was very complimentary of the run and the way the track played as he is a horse that needs good ground," Collett said.

"He (Super Strike) did a good job and I actually didn't realise that they ran

1.09.44 until I got home and watched the replay so I thought geez it's been a big effort to come from where he did to win.

"He just took a while to find clear air and had to come between a couple to make his run but he was very strong to the line."

Super Strike had impressed when winning his maiden on debut at his home track last November with Collett hoping to see him step up to better company before the untimely injury came about.

"When he had his third start and got beaten by Star Of Bombay at Ellerslie,

he pulled up sore behind," he said.

"When we watched the replay, it looked like he might have done the injury when he was clearing the starting gates.

"He was very scratchy when he came off the track which is unusual as most times with that sort of muscle problem it isn't for a few hours later when they have cooled down that it becomes apparent.

"It took its toll on him and he took a long time to recover although we had him ready to go in the autumn before the lockdown took effect."

Following his first up victory there have been a number of offers to buy the horse however they been rejected by Hepi who has been racing horses with Collett for many years.

"Janet, who bred and owns him, has been with me for a long time and I think she is keen to retain and race this one here in New Zealand for as long as possible," Collett said.

"You get offers all the time but I can understand when you get a smart one that you want to keep them and enjoy that success.

"He's a big lad at around the 560kg mark and there is still plenty of improvement left in him.

"He'll be going 1400m at his next start and will most likely carry the blinkers as he is a pretty laidback customer.

"We tried him blinkers at home the other day and he was very sharp so we will keep that option for him but I think

he is ready to go through the grades during this preparation.

"He will go back to Ellerslie in three weeks and then we will plan from there but there is a nice sequence of races around here over the next few months, so we have a lot to choose from."

Collett also reported that impressive Taupo winner No Filter (NZ) (Toronado) had made good progress since his debut victory and was still on target for an attempt at the Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m) at Riccarton on November 7.

"We're just deciding how we will go with him (No Filter)," he said.

"We gave him a very easy week after he won as he is quite a light framed horse.

"We're mindful of his nomination for Christchurch so we are looking at where we run him next and whether he will then go to the 2000 Guineas or whether we keep him home for some later assignments.

"With there being flights available to Christchurch it does make it easier for him, so we might just run him the once before we make the final decision but I should know where we are heading in the next week or so."

No Filter currently sits on the third line of betting at \$10 in the TAB's Fixed Odds market for the 2000 Guineas with the Te Akau Racing representative Need I Say More the clear favourite at \$3.

MCKAY BREAKS COLLARBONE IN ELLERSLIE FALL

Jockey Shaun McKay will undergo further tests at Waikato Hospital to determine whether he needs a plate inserted in his shoulder to assist the healing process for the collarbone he broke in a nasty fall at Ellerslie on Saturday.

McKay was riding the well-favoured Blood Warrior (NZ) (Makfi) in the last race on the day when his charge crashed heavily to the turf on the home bend after clipping the heels of Manrico (NZ) (Shocking), who was being angled into the clear by rider Jasmine Fawcett when insufficiently clear of McKay's mount.

Thankfully, McKay was thrown clear of Blood Warrior but knew instantly something was wrong as he tried to make his way to his feet.

"It happened pretty quickly but I knew something was wrong with my shoulder the minute I hit the ground," McKay said.

"Watching the replay, it looks like the horse that interfered with us has swept his feet out from underneath him (Blood Warrior) and luckily I got thrown to the side away from him.

"I knew it was that serious and I did manage to sit up to let people know I was okay which is something we get taught.

"It's my first collarbone break however it's on the same side as the shoulder I hurt in a fall last season.

"Jasmine did message me later on but I wasn't really in the right frame of mind to reply as when it's not your fault it makes it a lot harder to take."

McKay is expecting to be off the scene for four to six weeks although he will know more once he has the injury looked at again on Sunday.

"The initial doctor told me that it may need a plate to help it heal as the bone is poking up into the skin a little," he said.

"I'm getting that checked at Waikato Hospital so I'll know a bit more after that.

"I've had a bit of a slow start to the season so the injury has come at a bad time as I felt I was just starting to get some momentum going."

The injury also put a dampener on the day for McKay's partner, fellow jockey Sam Collett, who witnessed the fall from the judicial committee room at New Plymouth.

Collett had just been suspended for a week for causing interference aboard Supreme Heights (NZ) (Jimmy Choux) when winning the Gr.3 NZB Ready To Run Sale Trainers Series (1400m) and admitted her heart was in her mouth for a few moments watching the Ellerslie race.

"I was in the steward's room at New Plymouth and caught the fall on one of the tv's behind me," she said.

"I was thinking straight away I hope he's okay but I guess having parents that have both ridden and been there myself I am a little desensitised to this sort of thing.

"Once I saw him sit up, I thought he's probably just hurt his shoulder which is what has happened and is not as bad as it could have been.

"I drove all the way home from New Plymouth and then picked him up from Sam Weatherley's place as he had given him a lift home from the hospital.

"He's been a good patient so far and I'm sure I will be able to find things for him to do while he's recovering.

"He still has one good arm to push the vacuum cleaner around so he knows what to expect while he's off."

With Collett's suspension not commencing until after the Hastings meeting this coming Saturday, she will be pinch hitting for McKay on The Mitigator (Master Of Design) in the Gr.1 Windsor Park Plate (1600m), the feature event on the day.

Collett will be looking to bring up her second stakes win for the season on the six-year-old, who is trained at Matamata by McKay's father Peter, after gaining her first aboard Supreme Heights which also doubled as her 800th career win.

"I had been hoping to hit the 800-win mark earlier in the year but the COVID-19 pandemic put paid to that," Collett said.

"It's nice to get it out of the way as I've had a slow start so far but I'm keen to keep my consistency up and try and hit the 100-win mark again this season.

"The suspension is not going to be that helpful but once I get back, I'll be trying to keep away from that sort of thing.

"With Shaun being injured I've picked up his ride on The Mitigator so his misfortune is my good fortune I guess and I will be trying hard to get a win for everyone involved."
