SKY DARCI SNARES LION ROCK TROPHY HANDICAP IN A THRILLER

Caspar Fownes regained the trainers' championship lead and celebrated the successful race-track return of BMW Hong Kong Derby winner **Sky Darci (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) in one fell swoop with a pivotal treble, crowned by Gr.3 Lion Rock Trophy Handicap (1600m) glory at Sha Tin.

The highlight for Fownes, who trained three winners on the day, was Sky Darci's resumption after a 10-week break, culminating in a short head victory over fellow four-year-old Healthy Happy (Zoustar). Not Usual Talent (NZ) (Zacinto) was third, one and three-quarter lengths further back.

"On paper it looked a nice comeback race for him, 115 (pounds) on his back and a nice soft draw (barrier three). He landed in the spot we thought he would be, just relaxed and came out and you can see what he's got," Fownes said after Sky Darci withstood a fierce challenge from

Healthy Happy, who lifted bravely after being headed by the winner.

"Obviously the second horse (Healthy Happy) is a horse we respected coming into the race because we didn't think there was much pace and obviously, he gave us quite a scare the last 100m.

"He's a nice horse, the second horse. He's probably one that's going to go on with it.

"At the end of the day, we're very happy to bring him back from the Derby. There's always pressure on you to get these horses to come back and perform."

Sky Darci's latest triumph leaves Fownes with a host of long-range options beyond a possible start in the Gr.3 Premier Cup Handicap (1400m) – including a potential tilt at the Gr.1 LONGINES Hong Kong Sprint (1200m) in December.

"It looks like we've got something to work with going forward to December. He's a good horse and he's probably still got another length and a half to two lengths in him over the next 12 months. If he can do that, all of sudden he's a serious and proper horse," Fownes said, hinting at taking a path which avoids clashing with Golden Sixty (Medaglia D'Oro) over a mile.

"He's a sprinter-miler in my mind and he's showing us that, so we'll just

try to pick the best possible options and avoid the champions."

Sky Darci was plucked from New Zealand as a PPG (Privately Purchased Griffin), joining the Fownes stable as a raw, unraced gelding in 2019.

Bred by Mark Freeman and David Price, Sky Darci is a graduate from Sam and Libby Bleakley's Highden Park after being sold for \$160,000 at the 2018 Karaka Book 1 Yearling Sale to the Kwan family and races for Jessica Kwan Mun Hang.

Like a number of horses identified by Magus Equine's Willie Leung, Sky Darci did his early education in New Zealand, where he had two trials for Matamata trainer Graham Richardson.

"Sky Darci was a nice horse that we gave two very quiet trials before he went up to Hong Kong," Richardson said.

"He was a very athletic horse who always appealed as a prospect to go to the top."

Sky Darci is the son of O'Reilly mare Strictly Maternal and is the younger half-brother of Gr.2 Brisbane Cup (2200m) winner Chocante. He has won seven of his 13 starts in Hong Kong for just over HK\$23million in prizemoney.

AYRTON LOSES, OUT OF STRADBROKE

The budding star **Ayrton (NZ)** (Iffraaj) is out of the race for next month's Gr.1 Stradbroke Handicap (1400m) after a shock loss at Eagle Farm on Saturday.

In just his fourth race start, Ayrton was sent out a \$1.50 favourite to win the Gr.3 Fred Best Classic (1400m) and therefore qualify for a Stradbroke run, but despite a perfect trip from Jamie Kah, he failed to pick up the leader Apache Chase (Better Than Ready) in a tight four-way finish in the Group Three.

Despite never being qualified for the Stradbroke, Ayrton was into as short a quote as \$3.50 before his loss, but now will not make the field.

Ayrton enjoyed the perfect trail in third place and looked set for an easy win when Kah got him into clean air in the home straight. But try and he did, he could not find that brilliantly finishing sprint which was a feature in his first three wins.

After finding the lead his rivals were unable to catch Apache Chase who had a neck margin over Ayrton on the line with Gr.1 Newmarket Handicap (1200m) placegetter Amish Boy

(Star Witness) close-up in third place.

"He was a bit disappointing today let off the bit, he wasn't as professional as he's been, but I'm still happy with him," Kah told Sky Thoroughbred Central.

Winning trainer Desleigh Forster said she went to the races confident her Better Than Ready gelding could upset Ayrton and later confirmed Apache Chase will take up the ballot-free ticket into the Stradbroke.

"He's a serious horse," she said of Apache Chase.

"I didn't come here hoping, I was very confident coming here today.

"They had their chance. As long as he pulls up well, he goes to the big dance (Stradbroke) in two weeks and now we're going to have to sit down and find someone who rides at 49.5kg."

Co-trainer Mick Price indicated Ayrton's campaign might not yet be over as he could run in the Group 3 Gunsynd Classic over 1600 metres for three-year-olds on Stradbroke Handicap day (June 12). – **Racing.com**

ATULLIBIGEAL THRUSTS UNDERSTATED HENDERSON IN SPOTLIGHT

For someone who steadfastly maintains he likes to keep a low profile with his training activity, you can imagine that Carl Henderson has a good deal of trepidation about describing his work with exciting two-year-old galloper **Atullibigeal** (Street Boss).

Henderson produced the son of Street Boss to run away from his opposition in Saturday's Listed Auckland Futurity Stakes (1400m) at Ellerslie, prompting plenty of media attention for the personable 48-year-old.

Henderson is taking it all in his stride as a by-product of working with a potential topline but does admit he finds it hard for someone who maintains a boutique operation that

is mainly focused on preparing young horses for clients in the Asian market, along with working with a small team of local runners.

"I pretty much like to keep out of the limelight and just go about the business we have established here in Te Awamutu," Henderson said.

"We generally work with clients who buy horses to take up to Hong Kong and Macau. We break them in and get them going and then send them up there to race.

"I also have a few here for friends and clients and that is how we came about Atullibigeal.

"My wife and part-owner Ross Mackay's wife are very good friends as they were bridesmaids at each other's weddings so when Ross became involved with the horse, he got me involved as the trainer."

While he may prefer to go about his business in an understated fashion, Henderson has a solid grounding in the industry despite not having a family background in racing.

"I got involved mainly through my Aunt who had a few horses," he said.

"I used to go there during the school holidays and ride them, which I loved.

"I was 16 and weighed 39 kilograms so I was pretty much perfect to become an apprentice jockey.

"I did my time at Robert Priscott's, where I rode 29 winners during my apprenticeship and also rode over fences for a season, but I ended up breaking my shoulder, so I didn't see much future in that.

"I then went on to become Robert's stable foreman for a number of years, spent some time in Japan and Australia and also had a few years away from the game working as a floor sander.

"While I did get out for a time, it is a hard game to stay away from, so I got back involved with breaking in and educating young horses and it has gone from there."

After rededicating himself to training in 2015, Henderson picked up his first black-type victory on Saturday with Atullibigeal, who he believes can go on to become a performer at the elite level.

"He could well be a life changer," Henderson said.

"He has that much raw talent and what he did on Saturday was just the beginning for him really.

"He is still raw and has a lot to learn but when he matures and gets up to 2000, he can be a serious horse.

"I would love to be involved with that journey but after his win the phone hasn't stopped ringing with offers.

"It was the same when he won his maiden, but the owners put a pretty hefty price tag on him that slowed a few people down.

"The money has got even bigger now so you would have to be mad not to seriously consider it and very tough to turn down.

"If he does get sold, it will be a lost opportunity for me, but not something I will dwell on as he has been good for my business and gives me some further credibility with future clients.

"It is just a fact of New Zealand racing at the moment that the good ones are being sold, so you just get on with finding the next one.

"It was a very special occasion on Saturday and one that we have celebrated but the reality is it is back to business as usual on Monday."

MCNAB RIDING THE CREST OF A WAVE

A picture-perfect ride aboard promising galloper Dawn Parade (Dawn Approach) at Ellerslie on Saturday continued a purple patch of form for Cambridge-based jockey Michael McNab.

With 60 wins for the season already, his best since he commenced his career in the saddle just on 20 years ago, McNab has taken his riding to another level, one which he is keen to maintain as he eyes some loftier goals in the next twelve months.

"Things have gone really well for me this season, particularly in the last few weeks where I have ridden a lot of winners," he said.

"The success I have had this year has made all the hard work I put in to get my career back on track worth it and I'm loving where I am in my life at the moment, both on and off the track.

"I'm pretty much riding the same horses and for the same people as I have in the past, but something has clicked, and the wins have kept coming.

"I think it helps that I have done a lot of work on those horses and I know them well, so that is satisfying when that work pays off.

"Dawn Parade is a really promising type who I think is a Group One winner in waiting, so to get that win on him on Saturday was fantastic as he showed just what he is capable of.

McNab has had some well documented issues that have threatened to derail his career at times, but feels he is now in the right frame of mind to capitalise on his undoubted riding talent.

"When I came back this time, I just wanted to keep things very simple and

rededicate myself to my craft," he said.

"I felt that if I could focus solely on my job and try and ignore the distractions and the like that had affected me in the past, I could make a real go of it, and so far, it has worked out exceptionally well.

"My family has been so supportive, and I also have to thank my manager Aidan Rodley who has done a wonderful job for me.

"Aidan is outstanding in what he does, and he is there for me off the track as well.

"It has also probably helped me that a few of my peers have been off the scene for various reasons which has meant I have been in demand for more rides and I'm trying to make the most of those opportunities."

With winter setting in, McNab is looking forward to taking a short holiday break if he can fit it in, before preparing for the onset of spring racing.

"With the COVID situation at present, an overseas holiday is off the cards, but I'm hoping the family and I

can squeeze a week in Queenstown or somewhere like that in the next couple of months," he said.

"It would be nice to slip away somewhere much warmer than New Zealand, although that probably won't be an option for another year, so we'll just take what we can.

"I will keep on riding over the winter as when things are going well you don't want that to change, but I know Aidan likes to set goals for me and I'm sure he will have something big in mind for next season."

McNab is also keen to maintain the routines he has set up for himself and to that end his Sunday morning activities included a trip to the local supermarket.

"Sunday is food day so I'm off to the supermarket to pick up a few things, including a treat or two," he said.

"It's a routine we have settled into and one I really look forward to after wasting during the week to make my riding weight, so Sunday lunchtime can't come quick enough."

PRINCESS RIHANNA BACK TO HER BEST AT ELLERSLIE

Consistent performer **Princess Rihanna (NZ)** (Showcasing) got a just reward on Saturday when she stormed to victory in an open 1100m contest at Ellerslie.

The rising seven-year-old mare had finished an unlucky third at the venue in a similar event last month but snared the thick end of the prize this time, courtesy of a well-judged ride by apprentice Taiki Yanagida.

The Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scott-trained daughter of Showcasing made her usual good beginning to sit handy to the pace before looking to issue her challenge shortly after turning for home.

Yanagida didn't panic when held up for several strides at the 250m, extricating Princess Rihanna from a pocket before she charged to the front in the shadows of the post to record her fifth career victory.

O'Sullivan was pleased to see the mare pick up another victory as she comes towards the end of her racing career, while he also praised the ride by his young apprentice.

"She deserved that win as she has been running good races without a lot of luck," O'Sullivan said.

"She had bad luck there last time and it looked like she might find trouble again on Saturday, but Taiki was patient and got her momentum up nicely when he found the gap in the straight.

"It was a good race for her and when she can get a run like that, she can be hard to beat.

"I was also thrilled for her owners who have been very patient with her all the way through."

O'Sullivan doesn't have any major plans for the mare who could well be headed to the broodmare paddock later in the year.

"There isn't a lot around for her so we will take a look at the programme in the next few days to see if we can find a suitable race," he said.

"I think she is probably coming towards the end of her career, but while she is going so well it would be nice to think she could get another win or two."

O'Sullivan also reported that the Queensland campaigns for several stable members had come to an end with the individual horses each going in different directions.

"We had three horses in Brisbane, but they have all been turned out now for various reasons," he said.

"Dragon Leap was going to run at Doomben last weekend but after working nicely on the Tuesday he spiked a temperature on Thursday morning, so we had to scratch him.

"We've decided to bring him home and give him a spell before getting him ready for the spring.

"We didn't see the point in taking any risks, so he is having a fortnight in the Queensland sun before he heads back to us.

"Spring Heat has been retired and will now become part of the broodmare band for Hermitage Thoroughbreds while Force Of Will has been turned out and will do her future racing in Sydney."

O'Sullivan and training partner Scott will maintain a low profile over the next few months with just one or two winter gallopers in work, however they will remain busy getting their younger members of the racing team ready for the spring.

"We've lost quite a few out of the stable with retirements and the like but we have a nice bunch of younger horses coming through," he said.

"It's sometimes hard to know where your next good horse will come from, but it only takes one to get you going and I think with the talent we have on our hands it is going to be exciting to see which of them can step up to the mantle." – **NZ Racing Desk**
