SUNDAY DERBY PREFERRED OPTION

New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing (NZTR) and the Auckland Racing Club (ARC) held discussions on Sunday morning regarding the impact of Saturday's announcement that Auckland was moving back into Covid Alert Level 3 for seven days.

Of primary concern is the Gr.1 Vodafone New Zealand Derby (2400m), which was due to be run at Ellerslie on Saturday March 6.

Under the current Alert Level 3 status in Auckland and the remainder of the country at Alert Level 2, the meeting is unable to be held at

Ellerslie on Saturday. NZTR and the ARC's preferred solution is to move the Derby meeting to Sunday March 7 in the hope that Auckland would move back to Alert Level 2 at the end of the seven-day period announced by the government.

"While this is the 'best case' scenario, it is by no means a certainty," NZTR chief executive officer Bernard Saundry said.

"We are continuing to work through different options should indications be that Auckland will not come out of Alert Level 3 at that time.

"Our focus, and that of the ARC, is to ensure that the country's blue riband event for our three-year-olds goes ahead. Two World Wars failed to see the New Zealand Derby stopped and we are determined that Covid won't either."

"There are a couple of options

we are considering in conjunction with our stakeholders and we are all focused on making the best of the cards we have been dealt," he said.

ARC chief executive officer Paul Wilcox agreed that the focus must be on making any change work for stakeholders.

"Our priority is to ensure horses and trainers do not have their planned programmes unduly impacted. In what is a tricky situation running the Derby on Sunday is the best course of action, we have plans in place should that not eventuate but we are hoping we do not need to activate these," he said.

Should Level 3 restrictions be maintained in Auckland, Te Aroha is being considered as a backup venue for the Derby.

With the ARC unable to race on Saturday the meeting scheduled for Awapuni on Friday will move to the following day to provide two race meetings on Saturday. NZTR is also continuing to work with Hawke's Bay Racing and Otago Racing Club to determine they have protocols in place for racing under Alert Level 2 for their meetings on March 3 and 6 respectively.

RICHARDSON STILL BUZZING OVER HOME TRACK SUCCESS

After a night of celebrations at his favourite local restaurant, Matamata trainer Graham Richardson made an understandably slow start to his Sunday morning schedule.

Richardson and a group of friends had good cause to party on Saturday evening after he and co-trainer Rogan Norvall captured the most prized trophy amongst the local training fraternity, the Gr.2 J Swap Contractors Matamata Breeders' Stakes (1200m) with their two-year-old filly, Bonny

Lass (NZ) (Super Easy).

To add icing to the celebratory cake, the pair also scooped the Listed Matamata Veterinary Services Kaimai Classic (2000m) with Paisley Park (NZ) (Azamour) as well as one of the supporting events on the day with Light Brocade (Epaulette).

Richardson was still on a high as he described his feelings about the stable success, particularly in a race that means so much to the Matamata locals.

"I guess you can say that the

Breeders' Stakes is the one race we all want to win," he said.

"The competition is pretty fierce and to win it has given me one of my biggest thrills in racing.

"I don't often have too many two-year-olds as we like to give our horses time, but this filly is such a natural and so professional that she looked ideal for the race.

"I was really chuffed and the Swap family who sponsor the race are good mates and race several horses with me.

"One of the other nice things about the win was the camaraderie amongst the locals after the race.

"I haven't even got close to answering all the texts and calls I've had, although I will be trying to do that on Sunday afternoon.

"I didn't get much sleep as we went to our local Italian restaurant to celebrate and it was quite a big night.

"My best mate is Lance O'Sullivan and we give each other a hard time every day. He was one of the first to congratulate me and was over the moon for me.

"Mind you he still reckons he is a better tennis player and he kept reminding me all night although the simple fact is, he's not!"

Richardson was quick to pay tribute to training partner Norvall, the former Group One-winning jockey who is in his first full season in partnership with Richardson.

"Rogan is so conscientious and such a hard worker," he said.

"He's a real talent and I'm lucky to have him with me.

"We've got some really nice horses behind us in our team of thirty and some really promising younger ones coming through.

"I guess everyone gets their turn, but we don't take short cuts and the work we have put in is starting to pay off."

With the partnerships' first two stakes wins under the belt on Saturday, Richardson and Norvall are looking forward to further success with a trio of three-year-old fillies heading to the Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand Oaks (2400m) at Trentham in late March.

"We've got four in the Oaks at the moment although I'm not sure if Oh To Be will continue on that path," Richardson said.

"Ali Arc and Canuhandleajandal will have their lead-up runs in the Lowland Stakes (Gr.2, 2100m) at Hastings on Wednesday while Carolina Reaper is in the Sunline Vase (Gr.3, 2100m) at Ellerslie on Sunday, depending on what happens with the current COVID-19 outbreak.

"I'm delighted with how all three of those fillies are coming along, although it would be an extra thrill if Ali Arc could win as she is part-owned by the Swap family and it would be a nice synergy with the result from Bonny Lass."

Richardson is also hoping his good fortune continues for at least another week with two important events coming up.

"I've been renting a house in Matamata for quite a while after my original home burnt down and they finally get started on building a new one for me on Monday.

"The demolition guys are coming in to bowl the old structure although I think my oldest son and his mates did a fair bit of their job for them on Saturday night when they had a party there.

"I'm also hoping that the COVID lockdown sorts itself out as we have Defibrillate running in the Australian Cup (Gr.1, 2000m) at Flemington on Saturday.

"Last time the syndicate all got together and watched the race, so we're keen to do that again.

"I don't think I've ever been more nervous that when he ran last time and now he is in one of the biggest Group Ones in Australia, I'm sure I will be feeling it again."

Defibrillate won two of his three New Zealand starts when prepared by Richardson and has continued to show his wares under the guidance of Patrick Payne in Melbourne, having won seven races from ten starts including his last four in a row.

STAKES ASSIGNMENT FOR PROMISING THREE-YEAR-OLD

A comprehensive three-length victory at Matamata on Saturday has set promising three-year-old **Tar And Cement (NZ)** (Reliable Man) on a path to the Gr.2 Fusion Electrical Wellington Guineas (1400m) at Trentham next month.

The Reliable Man gelding made it two wins from two starts when he led all the way over 1400m on the weekend for trainer Tony Pike, who has a big opinion of his charge.

"He's a very promising type who has taken a while to get his act together," Pike said.

"He's a pretty well put together horse who is quite versatile.

"He led in several of his trials but first up at Hastings he bombed the start and came from well back to win.

"There wasn't a lot of pace in the race yesterday, so I left it up to Leith (Innes) as to how he would ride him.

"The track certainly suited those on the speed early on, so he let him bowl along and he did the job very nicely."

Despite the comfortable nature of the victory, Pike is well aware Tar And Cement's racing manners are still a work in progress.

"He was quite green in the run home when he let him off the bridle, so we still have work to do there," he said.

"He had quite a few barrier trials before he went to the races as he was very much a work in progress.

"He wanted to do a hell of a lot wrong, but on his breeding, we believe he will get better with age so there's a lot to look forward to."

Bred and co-owned by Darryl Burrow, the president of the Wellington branch of the New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders Association, Tar And Cement has attracted plenty of interest from offshore interests with Pike resigned to the possibility the horse could be sold, having fielded numerous calls after his debut victory and more again overnight.

"There has been plenty of interest in him and the phone has been going constantly last night and again this morning (Sunday)," he said.

"I'm going to give Darryl a call and discuss it all with him.

"Darryl and his wife have been family friends for a number of years and I've trained quite a few horses for him.

"We will see what eventuates going forward, but he has plenty of scope to develop into a pretty handy horse."

Tar And Cement is out of Burrow's Stravinsky mare Classical, a daughter of stakes winner Showtime who is the dam of former Queensland galloper Game On.

ALL ROADS LEAD TO TE AROHA FOR COVENTINA BAY

Taranaki trainer Robbie Patterson took time out on Sunday morning for a spot of fishing with a group of mates, safe in the knowledge he has progressive galloper **Coventina Bay** right where he wants her as a Group One target looms.

The Shamexpress five-year-old gave punters a sparkling display of her raw speed when she came from near last on the home turn to blow her female rivals away in the Lisa Chittick Plate (1400m) at Matamata on Saturday.

It was just what Patterson wanted to see after giving the mare time to get over her last start third in the Gr.2 Rich Hill Mile (1600m) on New Year's Day, where she put in another huge late burst to claim her minor placing.

"She has got such a turn of foot and she showed that again yesterday," Patterson said.

"This time she got the breaks when she needed them and put them away nicely.

"It will be interesting to digest her sectionals as she closed out that last piece pretty quickly.

"She does need her races run to suit, but she is getting better every start and I think she was the best I have ever had her going into this race."

Coventina Bay ran her final 600m in 33.72, the fastest final three furlongs of the day, with dominant juvenile winner Sword Of State (33.98) the only other horse on the card to close in under 34 seconds.

Saturday's victory made it seven wins from just 12 career starts for Coventina Bay, with Patterson keen to see her add to her stakes tally after picking up the Listed J Swap Sprint (1400m) at Te Rapa back in December.

"She has pulled up really well this morning and is bouncing around and full of life," he said.

"Our main goal is the Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (Gr.1, 1600m) at Te Aroha in April so she can have one more run before then.

"I think that will most likely be in the Cuddle Stakes (Gr.3, 1600m) at Trentham on Oaks Day as it sits nicely three weeks out from Te Aroha."

Patterson was also satisfied with the performance of stablemate Lady Rudolph in the same race, despite the Rip Van Winkle mare finishing near last after bombing the start.

"She (Lady Rudolph) needed the run as she is in a difficult place in the handicaps and it has been hard to get a start for her," he said.

"She blew it at the start which put paid to her chances, but I thought she ran home well and was pretty much in behind the pack that finished in midfield.

"She didn't disgrace herself and she will be competitive next time."

Coventina Bay is the great-granddaughter of multiple Group One winner Nimue and hails from a family that includes stakes performers Deane Martin, Pipi Beel and Lucky Feather.
